Letter from the Editor

I had a booth at the Canby 4H tack sale yesterday. Alex was at a sale when he was 6 weeks and now has been back at 6 months. He was a great sport both times in spite of having to get up at 4 am.

I was a bit surprised when I got to the sale to set up at 7:30 and found out that they had started letting people in at 7. I wonder when that changed? It is a great sale though, and lots of people come through every time and it just costs \$20. My sales were not so good this time, but I at least paid for my booth, and hopefully the exposure will result in later sales.

I like to have booths at shows, but I have to pick the inexpensive ones to minimize my losses. Most shows I break even; I rarely make much profit. Unfortunately the price of a booth does not guarantee more sales. If it did, than the expensive shows would be worth their cost.

I have often heard vendors grumble about slow sales. If they don't make money, they will probably not be back. This is the big challenge with getting vendors for shows. The vendors have to feel confident that they will make not just enough money to pay for the booth, but also to make it worth their time. Perhaps offering an option of a lower rate plus a percentage would be effective? Or maybe offering smaller split booths for budget conscience sellers?

More important is to get vendors to return year after year. If a vendor does have a good show, they will probably be back. Look at Scottsdale- they have a waiting list for booths since the same people come back year after year. I'm sure the booths are not cheap, but they are successful. The vendors sell their products and make money, so they leave the show happy.

There are good deals at horse show booths, so take a look around next time you were at a show. If you buy something you want, it is a good deal for you, for the vendor and for the show.

Treasures Report: We broke even w@ \$135.00 AiM has \$25,870.50 in the bank.

By Laws: Billie Joe is not here and nothing has been done on it.

Old business:

AiM @ the Hood. Already to go! Kaye getting phone calls in regards to the show. Lisa posted it on Face book, USDF and Fort Vancouver. Good Job. We need to order Ribbons. Sweat shirts with hoodies? Certificates? Turn in your ribbons for a prize? All the judges are ready to go with the contracts signed. Jumps – Heath Curry was supposed to get new jumps, but is no longer involved. Ahna and Scott Bowman will be organizing the jumps.

Dressage court – Jennifer's chapter will be keeping that organized.

2010 AiM Classic business:

Jumper judge is taken care of. Secretary?? Front end person that needs to be on site – Debbie Hinds. Lisa to do schedules. Kaye to do data entry for results and pre show reports.

Ahna does like the plan! Marcia is checking into the food vendors and we are just having food. No clothing vendors etc.

2011 -2013 AiM Classic date changes:

Couple of options – June 16-19th, June 30- July 3rd, Aug 25-28th – These are the dates that Devonwood has open. Primary date was early June and the secondary date was the August date.

Sport horse Region 5 has both shows July 1-5. This may make the late June dates hard. Ahna's reasons for date change: Barns that attend Youth Nationals and qualifications. It is too hard and pushes the riders and horses too much. The opportunity for the youth to have Nationals because Sport horse Nationals is moving to Kentucky.

Linda Royer is in favor of the June dates. Barb is against early June because of the youth graduations and April to July – all the shows are scrunched up.

Kaye had the survey results: 8 in favor of late August -30 horses, 7 in favor of early August (the current dates), 4 people in favor of mid June -10 horses, 4 people in favor for late June -10 horses.

Trainer side: Ahna does not agree with the survey.

Amateur side: Lisa's comment was that this show is their National. We school at home without trainers and sometimes we are not financially about to do it all. We can go to open shows to qualify; the regional show is not needed.

If we move to mid June, then riders need a shorter time to qualify. Kaye suggests that we keep it later in the year and "See the show for the North West as a destination Show." Ahna said that the later August date would work and Canada will go.

August 25-28 is the new date. We need to call Devon Wood and Jennifer Milburn about those dates. We need to check with Devon Wood about a price break on stall and offer a 3 year contract. Jon was to talk to her about the stalls before Wednesday.

Wednesday Meeting

Conference call meeting. Marcia offered appreciation for the effort. Next meeting day will be after the April show. May will be a committee meeting before the show on awards.

Sponsors – ads for sales leaving the platinum and gold the same price as before.

February Thermal Dressage & Hunter Jumper Show

I just got back from the Thermal Horse show in California. The weather was fabulous. The dressage part of this show was a CDI which was a qualifying for international competitions. Heather competed with Escorial (Monk) in the Prix St Georges (61.053). Unfortunately, in the Prix St. Georges test, Monk decided to practice his one tempi changes in the lines of changes. However, he was 10th in the class--just making the cut-off for awards (and victory ride, of course). Heather also competed in the Intermediaire I and the horse was more together and the test was clean, including all of the lines of changes. She got a better score (64.474) and placed sixth (yahoo!). Guenter Seidel won the I1 class with Trinity. Trinity is a very hot horse (by Flemmingh) but is fabulous. A lot of the California riders were there including Sue Blinks, Leslie Morse, Steffan and Shannon Peters (Ravel wasn't there). So it was fun to watch the riders. Heather also competed my Holsteiner colt (Majek) at third level. He won all of his classes-they were small classes but I liked the blue ribbons anyway! Heather's training abilities never cease to amaze me--she's had Majek for less than two years.

We were staying with Meagen Gass (Jordan) who is a Hunter/Jumper trainer and is my neighbor (Oregon City). Megan has been training one of Heather's horses named ZZ (Zimbalist NBF, by Flemmingh) and sold him at the show (ironiclly to Shelly and Jeff Camp--here in Canby--we all laughed about that). Apparently, the Hunter/Jumper world uses these shows to buy/sell horses, unlike the dressage world, where this is rare (in my experience). Meagan and Heather have been working together for a while. Several years ago Heather sold Meagen a horse named Lola. Heather bought Lola and was training her, got an 80% at Training Level at Lake Oswego, then the next week decided the mare would be a better jumper (we all thought she was crazy). But, Megan bought the horse (renamed her Lolita--who accounts for taste in names anyway?) and has won a bunch of shows on her--has been jumping her Grand Prix this year (and maybe last year, too?).

At Thermal, the Hunter/Jumper part had all levels including Grand Prix. Of course, Meagen won a bunch of classes, including one where she jumped on a strange horse, and won the class against 80 other riders! There were lots of big names at this show (lost on me), but one guy stood out in the mass of young, and really young people. His name was Hap Hansen and he looked like he was in his 70s or plus. However, he rode the Grand Prix beautifully and with great confidence. I don't know how he ended up placing, but he had a clean ride.

We left on Monday, February 15 for Boise (where Heather is training with Ernst Herrmann) but the Hunter/Jumper show had another three weeks, including this week which is an "off" week. Heather flies in today to clinic this weekend at Summerfield Farms (Ilene Parent) in Battleground, so needed to get back. Meagan was still there (having a good time, of course) when we left.

Did I mention the weather was fabulous!?!

Our first show of the 2010 season is off to a fabulous start! There are so far 73 horses entered in the show scheduled for April 23, 24 and 25 at the Mt Hood Equestrian Center in Boring. We have grown our Back to Basics dressage show to a show with each sporthorse division represented. So far there are horses entered in classes in each division including dressage, hunter/jumper, carriage driving, sporthorse in-hand, sporthorse under saddle, and show hack.

There are 73 dressage rides on Friday and 78 on Saturday plus one First Level musical freestyle! Five carriage horses will compete in obstacles and reinsmanship while 10 hunter horses will compete in 51 judged rides over fences. Again many, many thanks to all who participated or helped at the Horse Expo. Hopefully the Bowman's truck is fixed by now!








Annapolis' latest daughter, a Morab filly. Born Saturday, 03/20/2010.
