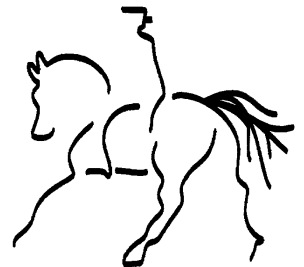

Attention Competitors - Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (US Equestrian Federation, USDF, AHA, ODS) for horse, owner, rider/driver/handler, trainer and coach before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards and breed association programs.

Limited Entries - Every effort is being made to accommodate all those who want to participate. Entries will be accepted in postmark order, but not before the opening date of February 6th. Entries must be mailed or hand-delivered to the show secretary; faxed or e-mailed entries will not be accepted. Since there are a limited number of slots for Dressage and Sport Horse In-Hand classes, those classes may fill before the closing date. If that happens, entries will be placed on a wait list. Per GR915.3(a): Ties regarding entries postmarked on the same day will be broken by lot, said drawing to be held at the address of the show secretary at 2PM on the Sunday following close of entries. Post entries for all other classes must be completed before the conclusion of the last class of the previous session.

Dressage

This is an Arabian division competition. Arabian Dressage classes are conducted in accordance with Dressage Chapter DR, except for exemptions listed in AR 156. If you are entering a dressage class, please familiarize yourself with both the Arabian and Dressage chapters of the USEF Rule Book, paying particular attention to AR 156 (Dressage subchapter), DR 120 (Dress) and 121 (Saddlery and Equipment). **DRESSAGE SCHOOLING AREAS WILL BE MONITORED FOR COMPLIANCE.**

Dressage Court Size - Classes 200-301 & 300-301 will be held in a short court (20m x 40m) with entry at A. All other tests, including Test of Choice classes and all musical rides, will be held in a standard court (20mx60m), with entry from inside the arena. Riders in these classes will enter the court and begin schooling as soon as the previous rider has saluted (unless there is an intervening break). When the judge signals that time has started, rider will not exit the court; rather, begin the test by proceeding to A and turning down the centerline.

Dressage scratches and 'no shows' - If you are unable or choose not to ride, you must notify the show secretary immediately. It is the rider's responsibility to make sure that notification is received by the show secretary - a message left on an answering machine or e-mail sent after she has left for the competition may not protect your remaining rides. *We recommend that you make sure you receive a verbal or written acknowledgement of your scratch.* [USEF rule DR126.1.b (3)]

Dressage Novice Horse classes - are open to horses that have not won three first place ribbons at Regular Member or Dressage competitions rated by USEF or Equine Canada in that level in which they are showing. USEF GR134.

Dressage Ride Times - Tentative ride times will be posted at www.arabianhorses.org by April 21. Final ride times will be posted on the website by noon the day before the competition and available at the show office. DR126.1.b forbids change of dressage ride times once final times have been posted. Therefore, please check your times as soon as they are available online, and report conflicts to the show secretary immediately. If you wait until you get to the show, we won't be able to help you.

Dressage Walk/Trot for Riders 11 & Older - Classes 301 and 302, Introductory Dressage (walk/trot) for riders 11 and older, will be held only if space is available at closing date. All entries will be processed in postmark order, with entries in classes 301 and 302 wait listed. Once entries have been processed, if no ride times remain, these classes will be cancelled, and these class fees refunded. If ride times are available, entries in classes 301 and 302 will be admitted in postmark order.

Hunter, Jumper, and Hunter Seat Equitation

For rules pertaining to Arabian Hunter classes, refer to USEF Rule Book, Arabian division, subchapter AR-10; for Jumpers, AR-11; and for Hunter Seat Equitation, subchapter AR-24 (AR 214 and 215).

Hunter - Open hunter classes are judged on performance, manners and soundness, in that order. Junior and amateur classes are judged on manners, performance and soundness.

Jumper - classes scored Table II Sec. 2b. Ties for other than first place shall remain tied and riders will flip a coin for ribbons. Jump order will be drawn. Time allowed is based on minimum speed of 360 yards per minute.

Hunter schooling rounds - will be available Thursday evening at \$10 for approximately 3 minutes. *You must pay at the gate and back numbers are required.* Fence heights start at 1'6" and will be over the type of fences used for competition. Sign up in the paddock for your desired fence height. Only horses entered in over fence classes will be allowed to school.

Protective headgear - It is compulsory for all riders in hunter, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials) / SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. All juniors riding in hunter, jumper and hunter seat equitation sections, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitted protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

AHA Hunter Seat Not to Jump Medal Class - Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday prior to Dec. 1, 2010. For a medal to be awarded three (3) competitors with proper appointments must compete. If fewer than three, then points will be earned. In addition to the rail work, all contestants are required to perform two or more individual tests from USEF AR217 1-4 & sub chapter 2 (EQ113).

AHA Hunter Seat Over Obstacles Medal Class - Open to junior riders who have not yet reached their 18th birthday prior to Dec. 1, 2010. For a medal to be awarded three (3) competitors with proper appointments must compete. If fewer than three, then points will be earned. To be shown over a course of not fewer than six obstacles with fence heights of 2'6" to 3'; which must include an oxer and two changes of direction (changes of lead). (Res. 53-96) Two or more tests of the top four contestants are required from USEF Tests 1-7, 9-15, 17-19 or EC equivalent. One rider per horse.

Cross Rail Equitation over fences - Cross Rail Hunter To be shown and judged as a Hunter Seat Equitation Over Fences and Hunter class respectively consisting of a course of 8

fences in Cross Rail formation set at a height of 1'6" - 2'0". Simple changes of lead and trotting not to be penalized. No additional testing. (*NOTE: Colored poles may be used*)

- Final order of class go and list of entries in each class will be posted at the show office and in-gate 1 hour before the start of the session.
- It is the exhibitors' responsibility to follow how quickly classes are progressing and to promptly present themselves when the gate person calls for their class. PA announcements, if made, are only a courtesy. Order of go for the class may be altered by the gate person in consideration of handlers presenting multiple horses.
- When everyone at the gate has shown, the class will be closed. Exhibitors on the roster who have not checked in will be recorded as No Shows.
- Scorers will be at arena-side scoring in real time. As one horse leaves the ring, the score for the previous horse will be announced and posted at the gate. Exhibitors who are not in the ribbons are free to leave.
- Awards will be presented **in the arena** following each class. Please be ready to reenter the arena as soon as the last horse in the class is done. Don't forget to pick up your score sheet afterward at the awards room.
- Champion and Reserve Champions will be determined by score and presented at the end of each division. For example, the top scoring horse from classes 128 and 129 will be named Champion Stallion, with the second high score named Reserve Champion. **Note:** In sport horse classes, champions and reserves must be at least 2 years of age. Time is limited. In fairness to other competitors, if you are not at the in-gate when your championship is announced, we will assume that you have chosen not to take advantage of this opportunity for recognition, and will pick up your awards at the awards room.

Membership Requirements

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. USEF Non-Member Participation - If an

exhibitor does not submit the proper competing membership documentation to the competition and the competition cannot verify such information, the exhibitor will be responsible to pay a \$30 non-member fee which is non-refundable. The competition MUST collect this fee, Membership Affidavits are no longer acceptable. (GR1309.2.b - eff. 12/01/08) Pas de Deux, Quadrille & Walk/Trot entries are exempt. www.usef.org

Amateur Certification - Every person who has reached his/her 18th birthday as of December 1, 2010 and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. This certification must be available for inspection or the competitor must have lodged with the competition secretary, at least one hour prior to such class, an application for such certification provided by the Federation. Forms may be obtained from the Federation. Certification will be issued only on receipt of the application properly signed and is revocable at any time for cause. Any person who has not reached his/her 18th birthday is an amateur and does not require amateur certification. There is no fee for amateur certification for Senior Active or Life Members. An annual fee of \$30 is

charged to individuals who are not members of USEF or EC who wish to compete as Amateurs.

AHA Competition Card Requirements - 2012 Competition cards for all concerned must be mailed with entry or entry will be considered incomplete. All riders, drivers, owners, agents and handlers who exhibit horses in the show ring or sign the entry form as the responsible party for any individual's horses at the show must be AHA Competition Level members with competition cards or pay a Single Event Membership fee of \$35 per person. Exception: Exhibitors in Walk/Trot (10 Under) or lead line

Arena Warm Up Schedule - will be posted for Lunging and Section Warm Ups. Lunging is not permitted within the same area at the same time as mounted schooling. When the only warm-up available is open to all horses and riders, riders with safety concerns or special needs are encouraged to wear an orange vest. *Eff 12/1/09 USEF*

Children - Children should be kept under supervision.

Dogs - Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Not allowed in café, arenas, grandstands or warm-up areas. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. GR1301.6

Feed - Feed & hay are available from local retailers.

Food - Food will be available on the show grounds. Check concessions for hours of operation.

Camping/RV parking - RV parking for the show is \$20 per night/\$55 per weekend. Some electrical hookups and water hookups are available on a "first come" basis.

Office & Facility hours - The show office will be open Thursday from 3PM to 9PM; thereafter from one hour before the first class until after the last class of day. Show office phone is (503) 880-3892. The entire facility is closed from 11PM to 5AM.

Stabling - Stalls are available from noon, April 21, 2012 through 5PM April 24th. No horse is allowed on the grounds unless it has been entered in the show and the owner has signed the release waiver on the entry form. All horses must be stalled. Day stalls available. Stabling includes first bedding (shavings). Straw and other materials are not allowed. Additional shavings may be purchased at show office. Stalls will be pre-assigned and assignments posted at the show office and in the stabling areas. Stalls are 10' x 12', solid concrete walls with wooden sliding doors and vertical bar fronts. Only blue painters tape may be used to affix signs & decorations.

Early arrivals/Late departures - If you need to arrive at Mt. Hood Equestrian Center prior to Noon on April 21ST or stay after 5PM on April 24th, the fee is \$35 per extra night and competitors must sign the MHEEC waiver. Contact the show secretary for details. If you arrive early without making prior arrangements, the stalls will be locked.

Cancellation and Refunds - Exhibitors who cancel entries

prior to April 6, 2012 will receive a full refund. Exhibitors cancelling after April 6, 2012 will forfeit all class and stabling fees except in the case of disability of entry. Should an entry be unable to compete due to illness or injury, a doctor or veterinary statement (on official letterhead), must be received by the show secretary prior to 7PM April 26ST, 2012. Such refund will include all fees less a \$50 cancellation fee. After 7PM April 26th, no refunds will be made. In the event of a show cancellation due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees will be made upon written request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation.

Drug and medication rule - A \$15 fee shall be collected for each horse participating in this show. (\$7 to provide for research, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs; \$8 to the association.) No horse or pony may compete in a class if it has been administered any forbidden substance except as provided in GR411.

Haul-in fee - All horses hauling in to show a single day must purchase a day stall at a cost of \$30. Day stall rental is from 7AM to the end of that day's show.

ODS Awards Fee - For breed restricted shows, the \$1/per ride down the centerline **applies only to ODS Members**. Secretary will cross reference the most current ODS membership list and charge this fee to all ODS members.

Payment - Make checks payable in US Funds to Arabians in Motion, and mail with your entry KAREN BRAGG, Show Secretary, 25100 Garden Acre Rd, Sherwood, OR 97140. Open checks will be filled in and deposited upon receipt.

Returned Checks - Checks returned by the bank for any reason will incur a \$50 charge per domestic check (\$75 per International check). No checks will be processed through the bank a second time. To retain entries, fees plus penalty must be paid by money order, cashier's check or cash within 7 days of notification or post entries will be applied to your entry. Show packets will not be released until all debts are settled. In the event a check is returned by the bank after the completion of the show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF GR913. Entries will be refused from exhibitors with outstanding obligations to any Region 4 AHA affiliated club or show. (R4 BOD directive)

Show Information

Awards - Awards will be given to first place and placings through six places, to eight in equitation.

Changes - Management reserves the right to make changes of arenas, judges or class order to facilitate time schedule and conditions. We also reserve the right to combine classes with fewer than 4 entries and to cancel classes which have no entries by closing date. All changes will be posted on the Announcement board at the office and the appropriate announcements made during the competition.

Delay of Class (more commonly known as a "Gate Hold") - In classes where horses compete collectively, when it is found that a gate hold must be requested by an exhibitor, such request shall be made to the Paddock Manager (gate person) prior to the close of judging of the class immediately before the class requiring the gate hold. The reason for the request must be stated. The gate hold will be a maximum of three (3) minutes. GR831.1: in classes where horses compete individually, failure to check in with the Paddock Manager or to enter the competition arena at the assigned time will result in elimination.

Motorized Vehicle Statement - In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which

allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Scoring Systems - All classes will be judged by a single judge.

Sharps Containers - for the disposal of needles and other sharp disposable instruments have been placed throughout the stabling area, every 50 stalls. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. (GR1210.4.)

Sweepstakes Classes - Are open to all horses, however, only horses enrolled in the (ABS) Arabian Breeders Sweepstakes program will earn payout points if annual nomination has been made to the AHA office prior to the show. Visit www.ArabianHorses.org, (activities – payout programs).

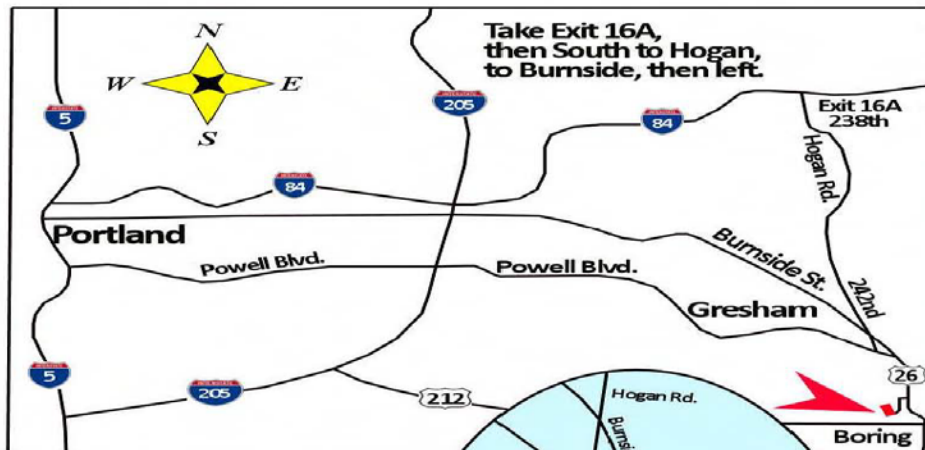

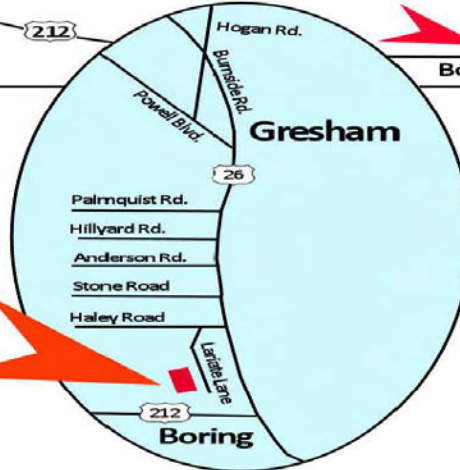

2012 USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal Program is designed to specifically recognize and encourage adult amateurs riding at Second Level.

Awards

1. USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal Recipient

The eligible rider with the highest score of 60 percent or better in the designated Second Level Test Three class or applicable test of choice USDF/Dover Saddlery Adult Amateur Medal class at a participating competition will receive a handcrafted USDF/Dover Saddlery pewter medal and neck ribbon. Winners will receive a \$20 Dover Saddlery gift certificate for the first three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals they win during the competition season.

2. USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award

A USDF/Dover Saddlery National Merit Award will be awarded to riders winning three USDF/Dover Saddlery Medals in the same competition year.

3. Year-End Awards

The USDF/Dover Saddlery Medal National Champion and Reserve Champion are determined from the average of the top three winning ride scores during the competition year. The champion receives a \$1000 Dover Saddlery gift certificate and the reserve champion receives a \$500 Dover Saddlery gift certificate.

Rider Eligibility

To be eligible, a rider must meet the following criteria:

1. Rider must be a current USDF Participating Member or Group Member at the time of the competition.
2. Rider must be an adult amateur in accordance with Article GR1306 of the USEF rules and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur as of the competition date.

USDF STATEMENT ON ANIMAL WELFARE

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
