The meeting was called to order by President Kaye Phaneuf at 3:15 pm. Members in attendance were: Kaye Tanner, Karen Bragg, Amanda Howell, Jonathan Howell, Kaye Phaneuf, Jan Finseth, Billie Jo Morley, Barb Magee, Mary Potter, Lisa Kolke, Jackie Bienker, Zoe Anne Arrington, Anne Dufay, and Kathy Darneille

Guest were: Kan Kaldahl, Christy Tanner, Erica Steele, and Tina Capri

Minutes of the last meeting were deferred.

Treasurers Report, Karen Bragg, The 2008 Financial Report was sent around the room.

- 2008 Income for the year was \$71,265.00
- 2008 Expenses for the year were \$57,385.00
- Bandit Springs Endurance Ride lost money this year. There is still a bill owed to the forest service \$260.00
- Back to Basic Show profit was \$3000.00
- AiM Classic / Region IV Sport Horse Championships profit was \$12,900.00

A motion was made to discontinue sponsoring the Bandit Springs Trail Ride. The motion passed.

Karen Bragg bought reimbursement forms to the meeting for members to use. She asked that members submit for their expenses in a timely manor 30 days or less. There was discussion and it was agreed that this was reasonable. It was also discussed that expenses for the year should be paid within that year. There are some carry over expense from 2008 that will go on the 2009 books. It was discussed that we should be fiscally responsible. Karen asked that forms for reimbursement be mailed to her by US mail, not by email. There was a discussion about personal office expenses for supplies used for AiM. It was decided that expenses under \$25.00 be paid out of petty cash and would not need a specific receipt. However, persons must request reimbursement on the reimbursement form showing in detail what supplies were used.

Lisa Kolke made a motion that office expenses under \$25.00 be paid from petty cash and be submitted in detail on one of Karen's forms in place of specific receipt, if you did not have a receipt. The motion was moved and seconded.

Kaye Phaneuf reported on the Arabian Horse Gallery being built at the Kentucky Horse Park. AiM could be a permante part of the gallery with a \$1000.00 Gift Donation. Billy Jo Morley moved that AiM donate \$1000.00 to the Gallery. Karen Bragg seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Kaye Phaneuf reported the following:
It was time to renew our insurance policy with Jarvis Insurance. Everyone agreed on the renewal.

Everyone agreed to keep Arabians In Motion's Directory Listing in the Flying Changes magazine. There was discussion about the benefits of doing so. A motion was made by Kathy Darneille to keep the directory listing and seconded by Marcia Donnelly. The motion passed.

Jannelle Wilde requested \$35.00 reimbursement for the Arabians In Motion Listing that she placed in the PNER Handbook. Kaye moved to pay it and Lisa seconded the motion, motion passed.

Jon Howell reported on 2006 and 2007 Tax Filings. The filings had been made and received by the IRS. The 2006 filing was filled late and the IRS has fined us. Jon believes that he can persuade the IRS to drop the fine as we were making our first filing.

Jon talked to us about our 501c3 status, which makes us a charity. Therefore we can accept public support and fund raising for our activities

and donations can be a write off for persons making a donation. He will move forward with the paper work to make to complete this process.

Membership Report: 86 adult 1 yr. members, 12 adult 3 yr. members, 11 youth members.

Newsletter, Everyone agrees that Holly Lenze is doing a marvelous job with the News letter. There is still some problem with people not receiving the news letter by email.

Lisa Kolke asked if there was a policy regarding an advertising price list for the news letter. Currently we do not have a policy. Lisa Kolke and Zoe Anne Arrington will work with Holly Lenze and develop an advertising price list for the news letter. Classified adds will continue to be free to members.

There was discussion about the website not being updated, which is a big time consuming job. Lisa Kolke and Zoe Ann Arrington will talk to Scott Bowman to see if there is a way to get information to Scott to help make things easier for him.

Marcia Donnelly reported on the following activities:
The endurance Clinic on March 7th is not an AiM Event, but looks like a great clinic to check out.

Marcia wanted to know if there was still interest in a cow penning clinic. Marcia has been in 2 clinics and says they are very fun. The clinics teach horses to work with the cattle. If there is enough interest, 20 or so riders AiM could have a private clinic. With 20 riders the clinic would cost about \$10.00 a person. This activity will most likely happen in the Fall and we could invite all of Region IV to join in the fun. The event would be at Para Havea in Molalla.

Other Activities: An In Hand Clinic was discussed about learning to groom and show the horse to its best advantage. A presentation of Arabian Horses at Dressage at DevonWood or ODS Breeders Showcase was discussed. A trail ride or horse trailer parking clinic is also a possibility.

We discussed the March 4-H Tack Sale was the same weekend as the Albany Expo.

Back to Basics is April 4&5 at DevonWood. All the contracts are in, Judge, Debbie Spence, TD, Betty Shambrook. Awards will be ordered. Prize list will be out by Feb. 14th. We need volunteers. Jon Howelle will be Asst. Manager on the grounds to help out Karen Bragg.

There was discussion on donating extra horse items to horse rescue groups. Zoe Ann has been talking with the Human Society and will continue to do so.

Kaye Phaneuf discussed the Aug Show. Scott has the contract from the Secretary, Jean.

The Show manager will be Jennifer Millburn. We talked about set up of the In Hand Tri Angle in the main arena at DevenWood and the problems they had. Also the Hunter judge was not happy with the location they had to judge from in the indoor arena. These issues will be resolved before the next show.

Kaye Reported on the 2008 AHA Convention. She said it was great and had a good time. Please read Sarah Asby's report in the Jan. News Letter.

Kaye asked to adjourn the meeting so we could get on with Karen's presentation. Billie Joe so moved and Zoe Ann 2nd the motion. Meeting was adjourned at 4:42 pm.

Due to Technical difficulties we were not able to view Karen's presentation. We did have an interesting discussion on bloodlines.


Welcome new members in February: Marcia Hobbs, Grant Howell, Jennifer Millburn, Chloe Teplick





1. General Provisions

To be held at the Region IV Championship Show. Rules to be reviewed annually by the futurity committee. All rules not covered by this document will be governed by the current rules of the USEF. Entries will show and be judged under applicable class specifications for junior horses as set forth in the Arabian division of the USEF rule book. Region IV Futurity Committee may modify horse's age requirement. Reining classes to be video taped

2. Tack & appointments

Western horses to show in bosal or snaffle bit. A snaffle is defined as a center jointed single, rounded, unwrapped, smooth mouthpiece of 3/8" to 3/4" diameter metal as measured from the ring to 1" in from the ring with a gradual decrease to the center of the snaffle. Rings may be from 2" to 4" outside diameter, of either the loose type, eggbut, dee or center mounted without cheeks. Riders may use both hands. Hunter pleasure horses to show in standard snaffle bits defined above. Full or half cheeks are allowed except in Hunter Division Bits will be inspected .

3. Eligibility

Arabian futurity entrants must be registered with AHRA: Half-Arabian and Anglo Arabian with the AHA. There is no requirement for Owners State of residence. Western pleasure and hunter pleasure horses to be 3 or 4 years of age. Reining horses and AOTR Western Pls horses 5 years and under. Nominees must have never been shown in a bridle. Bridle is defined as any bit with a solid bar mouthpiece or one that has a shank.

4. Nominations and fees

Nominations must be received on or before the dates listed. Nominations may be transferred upon sale of a nominated horse. The futurity secretary must receive notice of sale within 30 days from date of sale. Total futurity payments, if made on due dates are \$300. Late entry fee penalties are \$50 for missing first payment(\$350 total), \$150 for missing 2nd payment(\$450 total). Entries made after the closing of entries for the show, and up to class time will be \$500. All Stall, drug & miscellaneous fees are payable to the show. There will be no refunds or substitutions. **To Avoid late payment charges, all payments must be postmarked by payment date schedule.**

5. Purses & awards.

All money received from nominations will be allocated for prize money except a \$10 @ class promotional fee. Payments credited toward specific class entered. Prize money divided: 5 or more entries: champion 45%, reserve 22%, remainder top 5 11% each. 4 entries champion 50%, Reserve 25% remaining entries 12.5%. 3 entries champion 55%, reserve 30% remainder 15%. Awards made to an unrated top five followed by champion & reserve. A full top five placing will be given even if eight or less competes.

6. Division of classes

14 or less entries: one go around, finals judged at same time. **15-24 entries:** first round to be semifinal, number of horses selected to advance to finals will be determined by the number of entries in class. **25 or more entries:** Class divided into two sections: the number of entries in the class will determine number of horses selected from each section to advance to finals. **Reining futurity:** 14 or less entries judged as above: 15 or more entries: top five selected from first round: top five to compete for champion & reserve (held on later day)

7. Declaration of Classes

It is recommended but not necessary to declare a class upon first or second payment. You must declare a class by close of entries. After close of entries you are not allowed to switch classes.


