Region 4 Championship Show Moving to Nampa

At a show commission meeting held at the Region 4 AHA Championship Arabian Show this June, the commissioners voted to move the Regional show to the Idaho Horse Park at Nampa, Idaho for 2010. This move has generated much discussion so I would like to offer some explanation. There are many reasons for the move, primarily the declining condition and increasing cost of the Oregon State Fairgrounds.

There are no plans to repair the leaky race barns or upgrade the deteriorating show horse barn in Salem. We are to be charged for all portable stalls in the Pavilion whether or not we use them. Our Regional Show treasurer prepared a comparison chart using the Oregon State Fairgrounds (Salem) versus the Idaho Horse Park (Nampa). Even though the basic cost per day of using the facilities is the same, the Salem site adds enough extra charges that it would have cost \$10,000 less to have held this year's show in Nampa. Our 2009 Region 4 Championship show lost approximately \$12,000.

As part of the decision to move to Nampa, other sites in Oregon were considered but had to be discarded for reasons varying from not enough stalls and/or work areas for a show this size, to already being booked by another large breed show for the weeks we can consider. The primary sites considered were Eugene, Redmond and Central Point (Medford). We did not evaluate sites outside the Region 4 boundaries.

While many of us, myself included, have been happily spoiled by having this show so near to our homes, the folks on the eastern side of the Region have had to put up with driving the extra distance. We have already had interest from folks in Idaho, Eastern Washington, Eastern Oregon and as far east as Utah who are excited about the move. I personally spent a week at the Idaho Horse Park a year ago for the Sport Horse Nationals. The staff is welcoming and professional; the security and cleanliness is an outstanding contrast to Salem and I'm excited that such an exceptional facility is available for our desired dates. 
Ballots for the election of the Board of Directors will be counted at the October 27th meeting.



Report From 2009 SHN: Kaye Phaneuf

Marcia Donnelly and I were privileged to volunteer at last month's Arabian Sport Horse National Championships. All in all, it was a great experience, albeit a mixed bag...

The Kentucky Horse Park is immense! If you paid for premium stabling, your dressage stalls were in the three barns closest to, and a reasonable distance from, the dressage warm-up and competition arenas. But Sheila McElwee, who did not pay the premium, found herself stalled in the Hunter/Jumper barn EIGHT-TENTHS OF A MILE from the dressage venue, and 2.5 miles from her campsite. Some exhibitors, competing in multiple disciplines, resorted to trailering their horses from one venue to another.

All traffic in the Horse Park shares narrow asphalt roadways – pedestrians, bicycles, golf carts, trailers, horses, carriages full of tourists, competition carriages, construction equipment and delivery trucks, not to mention spectator vehicles, shuttle vans and maintenance equipment. There are no shoulders, no street lights, and no lane dividers or fog lines, but lots of mud due to constant construction (for WEG) and rain (nearly every day we were there; sometimes heavy, sometimes not).

As a cost-cutting measure, the SHN Commission opted to not spring for porta-potties. Competitors, spectators, volunteers and officials all hiked to the nearest (relatively speaking!) competition arena or permanent restroom, none of which were horse-accessible. I pitied any exhibitors accustomed to hopping off for one last potty break with reins strung through the outhouse door!

After a few days, we found one food vendor (The Old Farmhouse) that served 'real' food in a restaurant setting. Otherwise, it was typical concession fare – expensive, and the good stuff ran out early. The pulled pork sandwich (\$6, no chips or sides) always went first. And with water at \$2.75 per bottle, many folks felt that a \$5 beer was a better value!

Dressage was the only discipline held outdoors; even carriage driving was under cover this year. Heavy rains early in the week necessitated moving one dressage ring a ways down the road from the warm-up and remaining two rings, but the improved footing made the move worthwhile. All dressage competition and warm-up was held on a sand-felt mix, very much like the Equibase arenas at DevonWood. It drained fabulously well, and never got soft or sloppy. Note that we were not in the Park's official dressage venue; that had already been reserved by a large Horse Trial which overlapped the last three days of our show.

BUT, other than one cold, windy morning, and one warm but very wet one, the rains were just warm showers. From Marcia's viewpoint, scribing in Ring 3; and mine, running gate, checking equipment and scooping poop in Rings 1 & 2; it all seemed to run very smoothly. There were a minimum of conflicts with other arenas, at least during competition, although awards ceremonies at the end of the day were often lightly attended due to evening sport horse under saddle classes.

The quality of competition that we saw varied: good horses ridden poorly, average horses ridden well, and a disappointingly few talented horses really ridden to their potential. Unfortunately, with the venues so spread out, we didn't get to see much other than what was happening in our respective dressage arenas.

I did watch the Gambler's Choice driving class - it was very fun, and lots more interesting than the obstacles class held in the main arena as part of the Saturday evening gala. In Gambler's Choice, there are several obstacles of varying difficulty, with 60-100 points assigned for each. For example, a serpentine line of cones. A 90degree corner, defined by poles on the ground and cones with balls on top. (I think that one was 100 points, and let me tell you, some of them took it at a very bold trot!) An extremely narrow 'bridge' of poles on the ground, barely wider than the cart -- I didn't see anyone make it through there clean. There was a pole laid across two upside-down buckets. Drivers had to knock the pole off both buckets by backing their cart into it. There was an innocuouslooking 'bridge' - the gotcha was a sheet of plywood on the ground between the poles, which some horses tried to jump. In this class, drivers map out a route that will gain them the highest number of points. The go is timed, entries must pass through the start and finish lines in the correct direction, and no obstacle may be taken more than twice. The winning entry was a very fast, very confident grey from Wisconsin that scored 600+ points, about twice as many as the next closest competitor.

And we watched part of the Saturday evening gala – the jumper mini-prix (exciting, but only 5 entries), the driven obstacles class (not as much fun as the Gambler's Choice), and the dressage freestyles (disappointing). We faded before the show hack and supreme in-hand championships, as it had been a long day, and our volunteer shifts started at 8:00 the next morning.

It was fun to work with and watch people I've met over the years at convention and other championships, and to meet new-to-me volunteers, officials and exhibitors. But the very best part was getting to watch Firgrove Paladin and Firgrove Penultima go, and to finally get to meet their owners. You read about Paladin and Penny in an earlier newsletter; they are two of Pacifica's Arabian/Warmblood offspring who went to clients of Sandi Chohany's in Illinois. Paladin, ridden by owner Sheila McElwee, won the Fourth Level Open Championship with average combined scores of 66%, and went Top Ten in Prix St. Georges. Marcia saw the Fourth Level ride; I got to see the PSG, and of course hooted my head off at both awards ceremonies. At the last minute, Julia Trone, Penny's owner, found a very tall young man to run her in the Half-Arabian Mares ATH class, and the TD covered my station long enough for me to go watch. Five-year-old Penny still has a lot of maturing and filling out to do, but her movement was good enough to garner her first National Top Ten! It was very, very rewarding to see 'my' babies do so well -- even better was meeting their owners, and seeing first-hand how much they love their horses.

ODS Championships

ODS Championships were super. One of our AiM Youth members, Taryn Dussin, was co-champ in Training Level Jr/Yr (combined score of 68.400%), and finished 4th in First level. My daughter Mandy finished 5th in Training and 6th in First, but netted both Arabian High Point Awards with a 70.000% in Training 4 in the pre-show (won the class) and a 68.800% in Training 3 in the Championship 1st round. Those are her best scores in Training level to date in a USDF-recognized show, so we were quite proud. We wished her Training 4 test had gone better in the Championship 2nd round (62.400%), but we were still very pleased with the outcome. It was a VERY competitive field of young riders, and in addition to Taryn and Mandy, there was another young rider, Madeleine Brosius, on a purebred Arabian who also did marvelously, and several of us talked to her and her Mom to recruit them for AiM.

We were sad only because another fine AiM Youth member, Lindsey Hall, was unable to compete due to vet out. Lindsey was Training Level JTR Champion this year at Region 4 Sport Horse.

Certainly, the opportunity to show in front of three different S judges is not something that juniors get all the time, and an "All-S" judicial panel is something that was lacking at AHA Youth Nationals dressage this year. I can't say enough how impressed I was with the ODS judicial panel - Dr. Gail Hoff-Carmona, Tracey Lert and Mike Osinski.

Tedi Rae Paasch had a beautiful 2nd Level ride that I saw, and she should be very pleased with the rides she had. Jessica Crawford was again Champ in her class (we almost expect that from our long-time AiM Youth member, USDF Bronze Medalist and multiple AHA Youth Nationals Dressage Champion). Sarah Baily had a nice 1st level ride on SC Cirrus Wind in the Futurity Class. It was GREAT to see so many Arabians, HAs and AAs in the winners' circle at this show. I believe there were 12 total A/HA/AA horses entered and the breed was well showcased at this show at many levels and in each rider group.

Kaye was our TD, of course, and did her usual fine job, and Marcia Donnelly worked all weekend as a volunteer. Jennifer Milburn managed the show, with her usual calm and competent finesse. The whole weekend was smooth as glass, and I was particularly impressed to see Foxvillage software used to its fullest potential, with an "E-Scribe" with a laptop along side every Judge and "traditional" Scribe, and provisional results transmitted via Wi-Fi nearly real-time to the Show Office, and reported by the announcer within minutes of the completion of each ride.

We defintely felt fully high-tech and "21st Century" at this show. That rapid score tabulation and reporting supported efficient awards presentations, that were done in groups of completed classes on Sunday at 10 am, 1 pm and 4 pm, as breaks were taken in the Sand Arena. It was fantastic!

If I passed over proper mention of any other member of the AiM contingent at ODS Championships, my apologies and my excuse is that I'm just an overworked show Dad who had to get up early and go to bed late every day and had to multi-task all weekend.






