2010 will be the last Sport Horse Nationals Show in Napa, Idaho. After that the show will be held at the Kentucky Horse Park. We should all be thinking about attending that show and the next Party.

October 18th was the Canby 4-H Tack Sale. The Sale was very fun and Successful.

2008 AiM/Region IV Championship Show results were reported very late. Fines have been paid. The final financial report from the show is not completed yet.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the members present.

Karen Bragg moved to approve the minute as published. Kathy Darneille seconded the motion.



Arabian Horse Association Convention 2008

This past November I again attended the Arabian Horse Association annual convention as an alternate delegate representing our AiM club. During the convention I attended several committee meetings and would like to share some of the highlights of each committee which will affect the some of our club members.

1. Dressage: Some dressage classes will be added to the Sport Horse National show. The 1st and 2nd level classes will be split into purebred and half/anglo Arabian classes. Also, added will be dressage training level, junior horses. Also discussed, was changing how achievement award points are given for walk/trot classes for 10 and under. Currently the points are based on number of riders in the class but it is proposed that points be awarded based on scores. This will probably be introduced as a resolution in 2009. Next year may be a resolution in regard to dressage freestyle test of choice. This is to be placed on the approved class list and results could result in achievement award points. It was also discussed to improve the dressage rider awards. Possibly changing so like some of the US Dressage Federation awards.

2. Sporthorse: Two resolutions were on the agenda related to Sport Horse. Resolution 24 was splitting sporthorse classes into horse types. Basically, no agreement could be reached in regard how to define this split...dressage vs hunter type, vertical vs. horizontal type, etc. Defining what an Arabian sporthorse is has always been a problem. The survey taken on how committee members felt in regard to a split showed not a clear result on what folks wanted. It was then decided to look more closely at the results of the survey, return the resolution to committee and table the motion. If you have strong opinions on how this split should be and you are not a member of the sporthorse committee, sign up through the AHA website so your opinion can be heard.

Resolutions 22 and 23 involved discussion of appointments for in hand classes. For bridles it was decided to make nosebands optional. For those exhibitors using nosebands, a list of approved nosebands was created. Halter colors were also modified. For the full wording of these resolutions which passed at the convention, refer to the AHA website at

The committee also voted to work on changing the Horse of the Year award. Currently champions and reserve champions of in hand classes, do not get extra points for the USEF Horse of the Year awards. This is something that needs to be worked on.

There is an educational DVD being developed for exhibitors and judges in regard to showing horses in Sport Horse in hand classes. The script has been written.

It was also reported, that the Get of Sire and Produce of Dam classes have been added back on the standard class list.

3. Eventing and Driving Committee: Most of the discussion was developing a wish list for classes to be added to the standard class list as well as the regional and national class list. Driven dressage was the top of the list. A request is going to be made to the Sporthorse show commission that a special presentation of this class be made at the next Sport Horse National show. Another wish list class would be another obstacle class as well as splitting classes into purebred Arabian and half/anglo Arabian classes. A list of qualified judges for our current driving classes was made available.

4. Hunter and Jumper: The major discussion of this committee was adding classes for horses under 14.2 hands. In the open Hunter/Jumper world these classes are called Pony Hunter classes. However, since many purebred Arabians are under 14.2 hands, pony hunter was not used. Another resolution allows a horse to earn achievement awards in open Hunter Jumper shows.

5. Membership committee: Another proposed resolution was to change the membership year back to a straight calendar year from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31 of each year. Currently, one is a member of the organization for a full year from when they purchase the membership. The change was proposed because there has been some discussion of a joint membership with the USEF which currently runs from Dec. 1 to Nov. 30. During the committee meeting, it was pointed out that it would cost the organization 800 hours of programming change which would be expensive. Those who joined the AHA mid year would be not get a full year membership if there was a change and many would be joining the AHA twice in one year. 73% of the current members join throughout the year. The resolution was voted down by the committee and not passed.

1. General Provisions

To be held at the Region IV Championship Show. Rules to be reviewed annually by the futurity committee. All rules not covered by this document will be governed by the current rules of the USEF. Entries will show and be judged under applicable class specifications for junior horses as set forth in the Arabian division of the USEF rule book. Region IV Futurity Committee may modify horse's age requirement. Reining classes to be video taped

2. Tack & appointments

Western horses to show in bosal or snaffle bit. A snaffle is defined as a center jointed single, rounded, unwrapped, smooth mouthpiece of 3/8" to 3/4" diameter metal as measured from the ring to 1" in from the ring with a gradual decrease to the center of the snaffle. Rings may be from 2" to 4" outside diameter, of either the loose type, eggbutt, dee or center mounted without cheeks. Riders may use both hands. Hunter pleasure horses to show in standard snaffle bits defined above. Full or half cheeks are allowed except in Hunter Division Bits will be inspected .

3. Eligibility

Arabian futurity entrants must be registered with AHRA: Half-Arabian and Anglo Arabian with the AHA. There is no requirement for Owners State of residence. Western pleasure and hunter pleasure horses to be 3 or 4 years of age. Reining horses and AOTR Western Pls horses 5 years and under. Nominees must have never been shown in a bridle. Bridle is defined as any bit with a solid bar mouthpiece or one that has a shank.

4. Nominations and fees

Nominations must be received on or before the dates listed. Nominations may be transferred upon sale of a nominated horse. The futurity secretary must receive notice of sale within 30 days from date of sale. Total futurity payments, if made on due dates are \$300. Late entry fee penalties are \$50 for missing first payment(\$350 total), \$150 for missing 2nd payment(\$450 total). Entries made after the closing of entries for the show, and up to class time will be \$500. All Stall, drug & miscellaneous fees are payable to the show. There will be no refunds or substitutions. **To Avoid late payment charges, all payments must be postmarked by payment date schedule.**

5. Purses & awards.

All money received from nominations will be allocated for prize money except a \$10 @ class promotional fee. Payments credited toward specific class entered. Prize money divided: 5 or more entries: champion 45%, reserve 22%, remainder top 5 11% each. 4 entries champion 50%, Reserve 25% remaining entries 12.5%. 3 entries champion 55%, reserve 30% remainder 15%. Awards made to an unrated top five followed by champion & reserve. A full top five placing will be given even if eight or less competes.

6. Division of classes

14 or less entries: one go around, finals judged at same time. **15-24 entries:** first round to be semifinal, number of horses selected to advance to finals will be determined by the number of entries in class. **25 or more entries:** Class divided into two sections: the number of entries in the class will determine number of horses selected from each section to advance to finals. **Reining futurity:** 14 or less entries judged as above: 15 or more entries: top five selected from first round: top five to compete for champion & reserve (held on later day)

7. Declaration of Classes

It is recommended but not necessary to declare a class upon first or second payment. You must declare a class by close of entries. After close of entries you are not allowed to switch classes.


